

A recent article in our local newspaper was titled "Philanthropic giving down across Valley, state, nation." It described the drop in donations to nonprofit organizations that are diligently managing through rising labor costs and services. Many of those organizations were forced to limit fundraising activities during the pandemic, which put them at a disadvantage and fed into this downward trend. I'm pleased to share that the

Public Library for Union County is on solid financial ground, largely because Valley donors have persisted in the face of the trend. It's because of community support that our library retains highlyqualified and attentive staff, maintains a diverse collection of materials available for loan, and offers a wide range of day and evening programming. Your support means so very much. On behalf of the Board of Trustees, thank you for your steadfast support.

Through the efforts of many, many volunteers, we recently held the annual summer book sale. That three-day event raised more than \$21,000, slightly exceeding our goal. Perhaps just as wonderful, hundreds of people wandered among the tables and selected bargain-priced books - providing thousands of hours of entertainment and education. I honestly believe the summer book sale is as much a service to our community as it is a benefit to the library. As you note elsewhere in this newsletter, our Fall book sale November 15 - 18 is smaller but offers its own particular kinds of treasures.

Another special event is the library's annual auction, on Saturday, September 30th. This year marks the 33rd year of fun, and the theme is 'Leafing Through The Stacks.' Come join us for heavy hors d'oeuvres, desserts and beverages as you stroll around our lovely building, recall favorite 'reads' and identify a few to add to your list. It's an opportunity to bid on some marvelous items and packages and to enjoy the fun and spirit of the live auction! With thanks to generous supporters, the evening's proceeds go to support library operations.

Another way to contribute to our library is through volunteerism. Earlier this year, we re-started the volunteer program since it paused during the pandemic. At a volunteer 'job fair' staff members described opportunities to work behind the scenes, such as binding damaged books or preparing new arrivals to be shelved, or in more public facing ways. Attendance was amazing, with lots of folks signing up. One new volunteer opportunity is the Youth Advisory Group, a collection of 7th - 12th graders who collaborate with library staff on programming ideas - everything from community service to skills building and fun activities!

Again, it's the resources and talents of our community that make our library. And the library is grateful to offer itself back to our wonderful community.

Fall Book Sale: Special & Vintage Books


